Islamabad, (July 18): MMA Senator and Jamaat-e-Islami's Deputy Chief, Prof. Khurshid Ahmad, has condemned in the strongest terms the intrusion of the US forces in the Pakistan territory killing 24 innocent persons who had no linkage with any terrorist group. In his press statement issued on July 18th 2005, he further said, "The Pakistan leadership has shown no respect for our independence or honour and is digesting all insults and violations of our sovereignty. He further said: the tragedy does not end here as it is now reported that Pakistan Forces have killed 16 persons including ten women and children." "The whole nation condemns this highhandedness of our forces in the region, violating all precepts of the constitution, law of the land and human and Islamic norms of behavior", he emphasized.

Prof. Khurshid Ahmad further said that this abject surrender to American dictates has brought shame to the Pakistani Nation and further emboldened the US leadership and now even the Britishers to make totally unjustified demands from Pakistan. He further said that those who follow the path of surrender cannot expect anything better.

Explaining his point of view further he said "Is it not an eye opener that Turkey refused to allow American Forces to use its land or air space and Americans has to accept. Lebanon refused to submit to American demand to ban Hizbullah and America could not do anything and now even Egypt whose dependence on American is far more than that of our own has refused to surrender the Egyptian lecturer Mr. Mujaddadi AlMashaq to the Britishers on the strong ground that surrender of any Egyptian citizen to an outside country is against the constitution of Egypt".

"Where is respect for law, constitution and nation's honour, in the case of our Military leadership", he concluded.
